Online support available for UKS2
pupils to support mental health and
wellbeing.

Kooth, commissioned primarily by the National Health Service, is a safe online platform established to help young people with their mental health and wellbeing. Established in the UK over 20 years ago, Kooth is the largest digital provider of mental services for children and young people. It provides free, safe and anonymous online support and counselling to children from Year 5 upwards although it advertises from the age of 11. Counsellors and wellbeing practitioners are available from 12 pm to 10 pm on weekdays, and from 6 pm to 10 pm on weekends. It is a welcoming space to safely explore feelings and where young people can anonymously talk to other people their own age on moderated discussion forums, and chat to mental health professionals via messaging. Stringent safeguarding processes are applied.

A representative from Kooth will be visiting Oakmeadow in the Summer term to chat with our Year 5 and 6 pupils about the services they offer.
